The Board of Trustees for the Town of Flagler, Colorado met Monday, January 12, 2015 for the REGULAR MEETING at 7:00 p.m. The meeting was held in the Municipal Building at 311 Main, Flagler Colorado. Trustees Ivan Stahlecker, Tandi Moore, Charles Crisp Sr., Harvey Martin and Daymond Deatrich were present. Employees present were Justin Crisp and Doris King. At 6:58pm Mayor Thomas Bredehoft called the meeting to order followed by the Pledge of Allegiance.

APPROVE MINUTES

Trustee Tandi Moore made the motion to approve the minutes from the December 08, 2014 regular meeting and budget hearing. Trustee Charles Crisp seconded the motion. Trustee Harvey Martin asked that a change be made in Manager Report stating the property at 8th & Pawnee was past one year without utilities. Motion passed and carried.

NEW BUSINES

- 1. Town Manager reported Buffy Isenbart had resigned from the park maintenance position. Crisp also reported Melissa Thompson was willing to fill that position. The council was in agreement to allow Melissa Thompson to fill that position.
- 2. Crisp reported the transmission in the dump truck used to plow snow had failed during the past snow storm. This now places the need to replace the snow plow ahead of a frontend loader. Crisp has inspected a used 1990 Freightliner, twin screw with mowboard, sander and blade offered by the Colorado Dept of Transportation. This truck has good tires but has a broken leaf spring. Crisp felt \$10,000.00 was a fair offer for this vehicle. After discussion Trustee Ivan Stahlecker moved to place a bid of \$10,000.00 to CDOT for the 1990 Freightliner truck. Trustee Tandi Moore seconded the motion. Motion passed and carried.
- 3. Discussion was held regarding moving the time of the monthly board meeting to 6:00 PM in the winter months. All trustees agreed to change the meeting time to 6:00 PM during the winter. This change will begin with next meeting Monday February 9, 2015.

Trustees Ivan Stahlecker, Damond Deatrich, Tandi Moore, Charles Crisp Sr., and Chuck Kinkel were present. Employees Justin Crisp and Doris King were present. At 5:59 pm Mayor Thomas Bredehoft called the meeting to order followed by the Pledge of Allegiance.

APPROVE MINUTES

Trustee Tandi Moore made the motion to approve the minutes from the February 09, 2015 regular meeting. Trustee Damond Deatrich seconded the motion. Motion passed and carried.

OLD BUSINESS

1. Crisp reported on a meeting with Greg Etl from Department of Local Affairs. Crisp will present the grant request on Tuesday March 17th in Golden Colorado. This grant will provide funding for a water project to include adding larger lines which will increase fire protection in some areas, complete some loops that will provide more water pressure and prevent water from standing in lines. This project will also replace some old lines preventing line breakage in the future. This update is a much needed project. Crisp explained even with the recent increase in water rates DOLA would require Flagler to continue to increase the price of service as Flagler is now at \$21.00 and the state average is \$43.00 for towns under 50,000 in population. Flagler has worked to keep the utility cost affordable for the residents but has created a shortage of funds to complete project such as this one. The water department has used funds from wastewater, trash and the general funds for several years to break even.

NEW BUSINES

- 1. King reported she had been contacted by Tri-State Fireworks asking what amount the firework display would be this year so they could complete their order. After discussion Trustee Kinkel moved to a lot \$2,500.00 for fireworks unless donations were made to increase the order by the amount of the donations. Trustee Ivan Stahlecker seconded the motion. Motion passed and carried.
- King presented an agreement from Winfrey, County and Hayes to perform the 2014 financial audit. Trustee Chuck Kinkel made the motion to accept the agreement Trustee Damond Deatrich seconded the motion. Motion passed and carried.
- 3. King presented information on Qwest Services LLC, a recycling company from Yuma, Co. After discussion the council agreed to wait for more information.
- 4. King reported Della Calhoon had sent a letter asking if the mutual aid agreement had been signed. Trustee Ivan Stahlecker made the motion to sign the mutual aid agreement, Trustee Tandi Moore seconded the motion. Motion passed and carried.
- 5. Gary Levi, Leo Garcia and Pete Castro with Ambassadors for Christ Ministries, Inc, Denver, Co. addressed the council regarding the land. The group would like to start a job training center utilizing some of the land offered by Flagler. They also discussed starting a small factory to build medical supplies. The clients of the center would be veterans, people coming from drug and alcohol rehabilitation and others needing to do community service. Once the training was complete they would return to their previous community. Garcia stated the staff would consist of approximately 20 licensed teachers and counselors which he would try to hire as many as possible locally. They council instructed them to complete an application and file the needed documents.

Garcia, Levi and Castro left the meeting at 6:44 PM
