RECORD OF PROCEEDINGS REGULAR SESSION

SEPTEMBER 12, 2016

The Board of Trustees for the Town of Flagler, Colorado met Monday SEPTEMBER 12, 2016 for the REGULAR MEETING at 6:00 p.m. The meeting was held in the Municipal Building at 311 Main, Flagler Colorado. Trustees Tandi Moore, Tami Witt, Chuck Kinkel, Daymond Deatrich, Ivan Stahlecker, were present. Trustee Harold Yutzy was absent. Employees present were Justin Crisp, and Doris King. At 6:00 pm Mayor Thomas Bredehoft called the meeting to order followed by the Pledge of Allegiance.

APPROVE MINUTES

Trustee Daymond Deatrich made the motion to approve the minutes from the August 08, 2016 regular meeting. Trustee Moore requested a spelling error be corrected. Trustee Chuck Kinkel seconded the motion with the spelling error corrected. Motion passed and carried.

OLD BUSINESS

1. Town Manager Crisp reported that the Town of Flagler's Water Improvement Project is complete but the training for the fill station had not been done. Crisp reported CDPHE would do a final inspection on Tuesday Sept 13th.

Clerk King presented Resolution TOF-RES WE-4 for acceptance of water improvement project. After discussion Trustee Chuck Kinkel made the motion to adopt TOF-RES WE-4. Trustee Tandi

Moore seconded the motion. Motion passed and carried

3. Michael Mack discussed his animal permit application with the council. King reported April 25th 2016 Bread of Life Ministries applied for an animal permit for 2 goats, 2 cows, 4 sheep and 20 chickens. The permit was denied May 9th 2016 by the town council. The council felt the number of animals was too much for the amount of land. Mack requested the council reconsider the permit application for the 20 chickens only. After discussion Trustee Chuck Kinkel made the motion to approve the animal permit application for Bread of Life Ministries for 20 chickens. Trustee Tandi Moore seconded the motion. Motion passed and carried.

NEW BUSINESS

- 1. Della Calhoon was unable to attend.
- 2. King reported after numerous request the residents at 306 Julian had made no attempt to license their dogs or permit chickens. King and Crisp asked the council for further direction on the situation. After discussion the council agreed the next step was to issue fines and set a court date.
- 3. The draft budget for 2017 was discussed.

REPORTS

MANAGER REPORT

Town Manager Crisp reported he had to get training hours to maintain his water certification.
 The council agreed to allow Crisp the training hours for training.

2. Crisp discussed installing monitoring software on the trash trucks. The cost of the software is \$50.00 per month per truck. This software would monitor maintenance problems, speed and idle time. Crisp stated he felt it could be a safety net if a driver was injured with no one around. Crisp is to obtain further information.

3. After discussion Trustee Ivan Stahlecker moved to hire J. Ryan Ashlock for the maintenance position. Trustee Tami Witt seconded the motion. Motion passed and carried.

4. Crisp reported the speed bumps on Julian would be installed Tuesday Sept 14th.

CLERK REPORT

- 1. King reported she had gotten bids on replacing the back doors of the Hospital Building and would be having that work done soon.
- 2. King reported some of the sewer pipe needed to be replaced due to deterioration of the pipe and two water leaks had been found in the basement. The council asked Justin Crisp to make those repairs.
- 3. Discussion was held regarding new flooring needed after the foundation stabilization project was completed. King will bring bids to the council.
- 4. King reported she plans to apply for grants to restore the front porch, stucco and install new windows at the Hospital Building for the next phase.

TRASH DEPARTMENT

STREET DEPARTMENT

Crisp reported pothole repair and patching was continuing and paving should be done by McCormick Excavation and Paving late September.

1. Crisp reported gravel was needed for the access road to the wells.

WASTEWATER DEPARTMENT REPORT

- 1. Crisp asked the council if they wanted him to sell the old wastewater aerators on the Colorado Rural Water Association classified link. Consensus was to sell them if possible.
- 2. Crisp reported a water flow problem at the Golf Course was corrected.
- 3. Crisp reported the Colorado State lab no longer provided adequate testing for the wastewater dept. Therefore Jaques had switched labs for the testing.
- 4. Crisp reported debris had plugged an aerator on cell 1, a screen was installed to prevent further problems once the aerator was cleared.
- 5. Crisp reported the wastewater plant was in compliance at this time.

PARKS AND RECREATION REPORT

- 1. Discussion was held regarding paying David King for finishing up last years recreation program and installing the batting cage. Trustee Chuck Kinkel made the motion to pay David King \$1,200.00 for his work. Trustee Tandi Moore seconded the motion. Motion passed and carried.
- 2. Trustee Ivan Stahlecker reported two Russian Olive trees on the north end of Lavington Park were falling and needed to be removed. Stahlecker also stated the Locust on the southwest corner had a low hanging limb across the sidewalk.

FINANCIAL REPORT

After reviewing the financial report Trustee Tandi Moore moved to accept the financial report as presented. Trustee Chuck Kinkel seconded the motion. Motion passed and carried.

APPROVAL OF BILLS Trustee Ivan Stahlecker moved to approve the bills and debit card purchases as listed. Trustee Tandi Moore seconded the motion. Motion passed and carried.
